

The Cayman Government has responded with regulations aimed at controlling the spread of the virus, including but not limited, to protocols for travel and gatherings. Consequently, indoor gatherings, including church services, are now restricted to 100 persons while outdoor gatherings are restricted to 250 persons.

The Government of Jamaica, yesterday February 22, 2022, announced a number of changes to the provisions affecting church activities under the Disaster Risk Management Act. These changes come into effect February 25 to March 17, 2022.

 Church Services – the number of persons allowed in the sanctuary for worship services will be the maximum capacity of the designated area for worship calculated at 1 person per 36 square feet.

For example – worship area: 5000 sq. ft. Calculation 5000/36 = 138 people.

- Weddings the maximum number of persons allowed is 100.
- Funerals the maximum number of persons (inclusive of officials) allowed within the facility/sanctuary is 100
- Burials are allowed Mondays to Fridays between 9 a.m. to 4 p.m., with a maximum of 100 persons.

The other relevant provisions remain the same as under:

- · No physical crusades, conferences or conventions will be permitted.
- · Physical gatherings are limited to 10 persons.
- · Stay at home persons 60 years and over. Fully vaccinated persons are exempt.

Please note that the wearing of masks, hand sanitizing and social distancing are still required for public spaces and gatherings. We invite you to comply with these provisions.


