Ebenezer Primary and Infant School – a beacon of excellence

Brilliance and resilience permeate the Ebenezer Primary and Infant School in Manchester, despite challenges encountered.

Though some students are disadvantaged due to lack of exposure and lack of resources, Ebenezer Primary and Infant School sees excellent performance amongst its students with them working at various levels. They tend to do well in Jamaica Cultural Development Commission (JCDC) Competition, participate in the ALPART Safety Quiz and recently saw one student representing the parish at a Jamaica Teachers' Association meet earlier this month.

Among the recent accomplishments, is that of Francine Samuels, a grade 6 student at the institution, who has been placed third in the parish in the Lay Magistrate's Association of Jamaica's (LMAJ) essay competition. The competition is one of the social programmes initiated by the LMAJ with this year's focus being on how students have coped during the pandemic. Francine is noted to have an excellent attitude to work, which makes her an exceptional student. Her essay will now be judged against those from other parishes.

A stone of help

Throughout the pandemic, many students have suffered due to no access to internet, devices and or inability to afford textbooks. With this in mind, the school leadership has sought to support the children by sourcing devices, internet connection and data, providing extra lessons, one-to-one instruction, uniforms, books and shoes as well as food packages for some. The school sometimes receives donation from Canada, past students and other friends abroad. One such assistance came in the refurbishing of a cottage which now houses students and parents until their academic career at Ebenezer has ended. Staff development sessions are also held to equip teachers and psychosocial guidance sessions are available to both teachers and parents by the school's guidance counsellor.
