ARE YOU SENSING A CALL TO MINISTRY?

From earliest times, the observance of the Feast of Pentecost has been of special significance in the life of the Christian community. It has since served as a persistent reminder of the fulfilment of God's promise issued through the Prophet Joel,

"And afterward,
I will pour out my Spirit on all people.
Your sons and daughters will prophesy,
your old men will dream dreams,
your young men will see visions.
29 Even on my servants, both men and women,
I will pour out my Spirit in those days. Joel 2:28-29

In many respects, it is because of this fulfilment at Pentecost, immediately following the resurrection of Jesus, that the earliest Christians demonstrated the required confidence to witness the life-changing experience resulting from being in the company of Jesus. Their actions, emanating from this newly found confidence, served to ignite and propel the spread of this Good News (Gospel) beyond Jerusalem, Judea, Samaria and, indeed, unto the farthest reaches of the earth.

That being the case, you and I, as members of the Church in general, and the United Church in Jamaica and the Cayman Islands in particular, are in a time and season such as this, challenged to ask hard questions about the significance of this observance for us in the twenty-first century.

Over the last two plus decades, our Church has used this time to summon our members to contemplation and commitment or recommitment to the unfinished task of being faithful to the call and commission of God through Jesus Christ.

It is to this that we seek to return during the 2022 observance of Pentecost. We consider this an opportune time for each of us to examine the purpose for which God's Spirit has been and continues to be poured out upon us. It is time to ask fresh questions concerning how we respond to the task entrusted to us and for which we are constantly being empowered by God.

The Ministerial Formation Programme, on behalf of the wider Synod and its leadership, invites us once again to acknowledge that every single one of God's people, regardless of age or gender, location or circumstances, has been gifted and empowered to be a meaningful and faithful participant in the mission given to us by Jesus Christ because the Spirit has been poured out on each of us without exception.

During the month of June, beginning with the first Sunday which is also being observed this year as Pentecost Sunday, we are inviting all our members, corporately and individually, to give deep and honest thought to the depth and sincerity of our participation in the work of the Church.

Please note that specialized theological training, though of vital importance, is not the only training we need to function effectively in witnessing to God's loving grace. There is surely a place for the training we have received as part of our professional development and from which we make our living. These too ought to be used in enriching the witness of the local congregation and enhancing faithfulness in the pursuit of the purposes of God. Each member is asked to consider and decide how this training, whether formal or informal,

The services were being offered by professionals who volunteered. These included massages, pedicures, manicures, facials, hairstyling and barbering services, and








detoxes. Over 300 people benefitted.


