A Vision: The Charles Small Miracle Rock Garden at Mannings Hill United Church

History was revealed in its glory on Sunday, October 9, with the formal dedication of a spectacularly beautiful rock garden at the Manning's Hill United Church in the cool and verdant hills of semi-rural St. Andrew.

The 'Charles Small Miracle Rock Garden', named after its visionary as the title indicates, blossomed and came to fruition on a rocky hillside at the rear of the church and the adjoining basic school via the dedicated labour and other inputs under the inspired leadership of Elder Charles Small (or 'Brother Frank', as he is familiarly called). Contributions came from far and wide.

Blessings were offered by Rev. Ranford Hewitt of the Mannings Hill United Church who dedicated the garden and Rev. Sylvan Hinds of the Shortwood United Church who dedicated the Prayer Mountain (a special feature of the garden). Brother Ferron Hunter, a United Church member, contributed brief reflections.

The audience, through MC Elder Karen-Ann Harris McLean – a member at Manning's Hill and a Vice-Chair, UCJCI North Eastern Regional Mission Council – also heard greetings from Mrs. Rose Wedderburn, Regional Deputy General Secretary (NERMC), Pastor Philip John Smith, and Dr. Polly Bowes-Howell, a community stalwart and past student of Mannings Hill Primary School.

Mrs. Jennifer Martin, chair of the UCJCI's North Eastern Regional Mission Council and a member at Manning's Hill, outlined the history of the rock garden and presented the relevant plaque to 'Brother Frank'. The audience at the late afternoon/early evening event enjoyed musical offerings by the church choir and band, soloists and an instrumentalist, as well as, the spoken word.

As the weather 'held' and the glare of the setting sun dipped beyond the horizon, members of the enthusiastic gathering, comprising persons from surrounding districts and a few from afar, were summoned to stand and take a 360-degree turn to savour and embrace the wondrous panoramic view offered by the garden.

In his vote of thanks Brother Frank expressed gratitude to his work team and the many persons who contributed to the realisation of his vision, the Lord's assignment. He also issued an invitation to 'singles', for example, to remember the opportunity that the garden offers as a venue for their celebrations when they decide to 'tie the knot'.

The Lord gives victory to his anointed.


He answers him from his heavenly sanctuary with the victorious power of his right hand.

TRAINING SESSIONS

INTRODUCTION:

Purpose of the Child of God, "Living the Word, Changing Lives..." Campaign/Ministry The intent of the Child of God, "Living the Word, Changing Lives..." Campaign/Ministry is to engender a lifestyle that physically brings to life the action/activities of the Spiritual teachings of Jesus Christ among the believer. That is to empower the believer to demonstrate the "Fruit of the Spirit" which are Love, Joy, Peace, Longsuffering, Gentleness, Goodness, Faith, Meekness and Temperance. 
