On November 10, the doors of Ridgemount United Church, in Mandeville Manchester, were fully opened for the 2022 Service of Ordination. Scores of well-wishers, amongst family and friends, of Rev. Alja Dias were in attendance.

This year's event followed its usual order of events commencing with the procession of Clergy donning their red, white, and black vestments.

Reverend Dias, who is currently the youngest ordained Reverend in the United Church and the Cayman Islands, was the sole ordinand to the Ministry of Word and Sacraments this year.

This momentous occasion for the lover of arts and the supervisory chef came with a flood of emotions as he prepared for another leg of the journey. Yet, he remains grounded in the certainty of his call as a servant-leader with great promise.

Hailing from Lucea United Congregation, in the Western Regional Mission Council, Rev. Dias was placed at the Lowe River Charge in the Southern Regional Mission Council.

100 SANCTUARY

ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATIONS AT ELMSLIE MEMORIAL UNITED CHURCH 1922-2022

The year-long celebrations of the 100th Anniversary of the construction of the Elmslie Memorial United Church Sanctuary culminated on the last weekend of October 2022, with a special Anniversary Gala held Saturday evening at the Lion's Community Centre and an Anniversary Service on Sunday, in the Sanctuary, at 4:00 pm.

His Excellency Mr. Martyn Roper, Governor; the Honorable Mr. Wayne Panton, Premier; Church Leaders and Government Officials paid tribute to those who were instrumental in erecting the very first cement block building in 1922 on Cayman soil. They also paid tribute to the generations of faithful believers whose Christian witness and service made the Elmslie Sanctuary a beacon of hope and strength throughout the years. Situated in the heart of George Town, the Congregation continues to play a pivotal role in the spiritual life of the local community with its many events and activities.



Keynote speaker of the Gala, Rev. Norbert Stephens (General Secretary-UCJCI), emphasized that the 100th Anniversary is part of the celebration of the pilgrimage of the Congregation that began in 1846 when Rev. James Elmslie set foot on the Cayman Islands. Such a pilgrimage cannot be undertaken without being rooted in an understanding of three facets of Christianity: faith, service, and leadership. These three represent the common thread woven into the fabric of one hundred years of ministry and mission in the current Sanctuary. Faith, service, and leadership represent a perpetual legacy that was bequeathed to the members of the Congregation. Hopefully, they will leave the same legacy to the next generation following in their footsteps.

Guest preacher of the Anniversary Service on Sunday, October 30, 2022, the Rt. Rev. Gary Harriott, Moderator of the UCJCI pointed out that even as we celebrate the quality work of the builders erecting a sanctuary that stood the test of time for one hundred years, the greater significance and the challenge is

what this Sanctuary represents. The current generations are called to ensure that this Sanctuary continues to symbolize and represent God's presence, where people can encounter Jesus Christ, the hope of salvation, healing, and reconciliation.

The CIRMC extends heartfelt congratulations to the Congregation, its leadership and its members and prays for God's continuing blessing on their witness and ministry.


